LETTER FROM THE RECTOR A challenge for Lent

Dear Friends.

In our services in Sacombe, we have been following through part of one of the books of the Bible, known as the Acts of the Apostles. Essentially, this is the sequel to the Gospels: what happened next after the death and resurrection of Jesus.

It is an exciting story of difficulty and success, miracles and death, kings and slaves, necromancers and saints, all wrapped up in a journey around the ancient world.

One thing that we see again and again is the reliability of the record when compared to other sources. The towns and districts described really existed. The cultures described are genuine. The types of people really existed. The types of administrators are accurate, as are their names and their positions. Even the dates match against recorded events. In fact, the description of certain events (like one of St. Paul's voyages) are seen as the best written accounts of a voyage in the Roman world.

Why mention all this? Because for over 150 years there has been a constant attack on the veracity of the Bible. Essentially, we are told, it cannot be trusted. Yet my experience is that it can. Of course, you have to compare oranges to oranges, not oranges to apples. Where the Bible is poetry, there is not historical accuracy (like any poetry). When the Bible has parables and other kinds of stories, they are just that. But when it purports to have a historical record, I have found it as accurate (or more accurate) than any contemporary literature. In fact, why should we assume other literature is accurate and the Bible is not?

But I write this to encourage, not to try to prove a point. As Lent approaches, why not read the Bible for yourself? It is free on line, we have Gospels in the church, and we would happily lend you a whole Bible. And it can be relied upon. It is the word God has given us. However, as a starter, it is important not to read the "boring" bits, like the law for example. No one ever read a law book for fun! Instead start with the Gospels or Acts, which I mention above. Great true stories, a great read, but also showing how God worked and will work in his world.

COUNTRY MATTERS (12th February)

It is too wet to do any field work, and the same in the garden, but at least the days are getting longer.

I said last month that we could expect no calves for about six weeks, starting on January 7th (our bull was away, loaned to another farm) but a cow proved me wrong by calving on January 17th, a good healthy heifer calf, despite being at least 10 days late

The last sow farrowed a couple of weeks ago, with ten born, but after losses she has seven lovely piglets, hopefully all spoken for.

We had a welcome visitor recently, a Little Egret in the field next to the kitchen, where it could be seen clearly. Then an unwelcome visitor arrived in the garden; a Sparrow Hawk trying to catch Blue Tits on the feeders, we think.

BIRD of the MONTH - ROCK DOVE

The Rock Dove is very hard to tell apart from the Stock Dove except for its habitat, which is coastal cliffs and old quarries, where it nests in a crack or cranny. It is from this species that all domestic breeds have evolved, so when they go wild, tall buildings replace cliffs as their breeding habitat. Peregrine Falcons have discovered this and, as pigeons are their main prey, we now have these predators in many of our towns and cities, provided that they have a tall building for their nesting site.

DANE END DEFIBRILLATOR & VETS NUMBER

Please be aware there is a Public Access Defibrillator situated in the telephone box in a locked cabinet next to Dane End Stores. The code for the cabinet can be obtained by ringing 999. However there is also Village Emergency Telephone System (VETS) that enables up to 10 "good neighbours" to assist pending the arrival of the emergency services. VETS uses a simple memorable number unique to the village (01920 282999). This system can also be used for any emergency where additional help is required from neighbours, whether Cardiac Arrest or not. VETS volunteers are also aware of the code to access the cabinet if it is required. VETS does not replace 999 calls. Always ring 999 first in an emergency.
